MEET THE FHP BOARD OF DIRECTORS

PRESIDENT David Woodruff lives in Penn Twp. with his wife, Lea, an architect; their two dogs, Rigsby and Sebastian; and chickens in a backyard coop with windows from The Salvage Barn. A political strategist, David consults across the country, but prefers to volunteer here at home, where, in addition to Friends of Historic Preservation, he serves on the County Fair Board (best known for organizing the pie-baking competition), is an Iowa City Climate Ambassador, and is a Greater IC Community Leadership Program alumni.

VICE PRESIDENT Rachael Carlson has served on the board for several years and is the Iowa City UNESCO City of Literature Director of Operations. In addition to her programming and administrative work, she leads historical literary walking tours, showcasing the homes and haunts of Iowa City's celebrated writers.

TREASURER Lou Tassinary grew up in Connecticut, attended college in Florida, and pursued graduate studies in New Hampshire, plus an extended postdoc at the University of Iowa. BOARD MEMBER Marty Boller was born in Mt. Pleasant, IA, with roots tracing back to the Washington Township of Johnson County, IA in 1853. BOARD MEMBER Kay Irelan earned a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree in painting and drawing from the University of Iowa and enjoyed a career as an illustrator and graphic artist, and as a decorative painter and muralist. Kay's art is in the permanent collections at the University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics and at the Iowa City Public Library, where it can be borrowed with a library card. Kay served on the Historic Preservation Commission and lived in the Brown Street Historic District.
